- Sept. 29 3<sup>rd</sup> flyby of Mercury by Mercury Messenger spacecraft at 4:53 p.m. CDT
- Sept. 30 Sovuz TMA-16 to I.S.S. with next Expedition crew of 3 at 2:14 a.m. CDT
- Oct. 01 <u>Soyuz TMA-16</u> Soyuz FG Launch (It will transport 2 members of the <u>Expedition</u> <u>21</u> crew and a Canadian entrepreneur to the ISS.
- Oct. 19 New Horizons spacecraft 2000 days to Pluto encounter
- Oct. 06 Phobos-Grunt (Russian Phobos Sample Return Mission & China Mars Orbiter)
- Oct. 09 LCROSS Impacts Moon (seen with large amateur telescopes)
- Oct. 13 Cassini, Distant Rhea Flyby
- Oct. 14 Cassini, Distant Mimas & Tethys Flyby
- Oct. 27 Ares 1-X Test Flight (Ares program developed to replace Space Shuttle.)

Oct. 31 - Ares 1-X Test launch

Nov. ? - Large Hadron Collider restarted at reduced power.

Nov. 13 Dawn spacecraft on the way to Vesta and Ceres "entered the asteroid belt on June 30, 2008 and exited on September 20. It will cross the boundary once again on November 13, 2009 and will remain in the asteroid belt for the rest of its mission and likely for millennia if not millions of years beyond".
