Astronomy Day 2012

The W. A. Gayle Planetarium will be 43 years old this year. Replacement parts and qualified maintenance technicians for the Spitz "Space Transit Projector" are increasingly difficult if not impossible to find. Planetarium director, **Rick Evans**, is making a case for upgrading the facility. He has contacted Konica Minolta Planetarium Co., Ltd., to assist him in selling the City of Montgomery, Troy University, and Montgomery's civic and corporate leaders, on a new facility's ability to draw tourist. Rick explains that planetariums, like libraries and parks are not intended to be profit driven, but that the local economy is better served if more visitors are attracted to these facilities. To that end, Rick is planning to have a major Astronomy Day event this year and has invited Montgomery Mayor, Todd Strange, the Montgomery City Council, Chancellor of Troy University, Dr. Jack Hawkins, the Montgomery Board of Education, etc., to promote moving into the new digital age of planetariums. An Introduction to and demonstration of Digital Full Dome Planetariums will be given by the Konica Minolta factory representative. Following a private showing for those mentioned above, the demonstration will be repeated for the general public to be followed by telescopic viewing of the Moon and planets, courtesy of the Auburn Astronomical Society members. Astronomy Day 2012 falls on Saturday, April 28. Let's help Rick all we can as this is in the best interest of AAS as well.
