Wind Creek State Park Star Gazes

Thanks to AAS member Mike Lewis for working with the park staff and setting up a few star gazes at the park during the summer and fall of this year. Our first outing was planned for Saturday, May 20th but was cancelled due to clouds and heavy rain in that area during the evening hours. Here are the planned outings for the rest of 2017:

Astronomy Day - Saturday, April 29, 2017

Astronomy Day is a national event that provides astronomy clubs and other related organizations an opportunity to showcase the wonders of the night sky to the general public. This year, as in years past, AAS members traveled to the W.A. Gayle Planetarium in Montgomery, AL to assist in this effort. At first, the weather forecast didn't look very promising for clear skies, but it did clear up enough to permit some good views of the crescent moon and the planet Jupiter and its moons. AAS member Russell Whigham submitted the following write-up of the evening's activities:

Given such a marginal weather forecast, we actually had one of the best Astronomy Days in recent memory. The consensus was that the 15-20 MPH breeze may have been a first, mitigating the temperatures in the mid-80s and making for an unusually pleasant evening. As usual, Rick Evans had taken care of publicity and news coverage from WSFA-12 TV.

While AAS members were busy setting up the telescopes and shooing away clouds, Rick entertained and educated the planetarium visitors with show on "Two Small Pieces of Glass" about telescopes and their history and "The Great American Eclipse 2017", on what to expect and how to prepare for the August 21, total eclipse. These were followed by a "Tour of the Night Sky" in the planetarium, giving an overview of what the guests would see when they stepped outside.
